Eczema may cause dry skin. Home Care Keep the skin moist (called lubricating or moisturizing the skin). Use ointments (such as petroleum jelly), creams, or lotions 2 – 3 times a day. Moisturizers should not contain alcohol, scents, dyes, or other chemicals. Using a humidifier in your home will also help. Moisturizers and emollients work best when they're applied to skin that is wet or damp.

However they can also help prevent water loss by 'plugging' gaps between dead skin cells in the upper layer of the epidermis. Additionally they help smoothen rough skin. Emollients can often be compounds naturally found in the skin's epidermis – for example ceramides, cholesterol, or fatty acids. Mineral oil and squalene can also be used.
